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## The City of Atlanta awards design approval for 851 Oakdale



**Atlanta Ga.** – The Hoffmann Company announced today that the city approved their design for a Colonial Revival home to replace a 1950’s ranch at 851 Oakdale Rd. in Druid Hills. The estate lot, lying adjacent to one Neel Reid house and across from another, affords The Hoffmann Company a showcase for what it does best: design and build homes befitting their historic neighborhoods.

“When designing this house, our inspiration came from the past,” said Chris Hamilton, design manager and partner in The Hoffmann Company. “Like the architects who built here before us, we decided to incorporate the divine proportion and scale inherent in classical architecture. Getting this right takes time and effort, but nothing else can create the same look and feel. We chose a Colonial Revival style because it is period-appropriate for Druid Hills and will blend well with the surrounding architecture. But to make sure we weren’t the only ones who thought so, we worked with neighbors to ensure they were comfortable with our design choices.”

Appreciation for The Hoffmann Company’s design wasn’t restricted to the neighbors.

“When we presented the plan to the city, it passed immediately, without opposition and with high praise from the Atlanta Urban Design Commission,” noted Stuart Hoffmann, managing partner of The Hoffmann Company. “Our mission is to restore historic neighborhoods and it appears they recognize our purpose and appreciate our aesthetic.”

This Colonial Revival will be The Hoffmann Company’s third project in Druid Hills and may coincide with the Company’s first project in Ansley Park, a 1910 brick craftsman at 52 Westminster Rd.

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
